In-person, outdoor service returning to St. Andrew's

There will be an in-person, outdoor service of Holy Eucharist at 12:00pm every Sunday in the month of May (weather permitting) beginning May 2. This service will be held at noon on the church grounds and will be livestreamed as well. It will replace the 8am livestreamed service for the month of May. No sign up is required and chairs will be provided if you do not wish to bring your own. Masks must be worn and social distancing maintained. There will be no tent so please check your email for cancellation notification if the weather is bad. If the outdoor service is cancelled, you may watch the livestreamed indoor service on facebook or later on youtube.

Musical Note for Sunday, April 25, 2021

On April 25 we will sing the hymn "The King of love my shepherd is" to the tuneSt. Columba. St. Columba is named for the Irish saint who carried the torch of Irish Christianity to Scotland. The tune is one of the Irish melodies collected by George Petrie (1789-1866) and was included in Charles Villers Stanford's Complete Collection of Irish Music in 1902. In Ireland it is said to have been sung at the dedication of a chapel in the county of Londonderry. The association of the tune with this text, and also its harmonization, are from The English Hymnal, first published in 1906. - Sean Fleming
