In-person, outdoor service returning to St. Andrew's

There will be an in-person, outdoor service of Holy Eucharist at 12:00pm every Sunday in the month of May (weather permitting) beginning May 2. This service will be held at noon on the church grounds and will be livestreamed as well. It will replace the 8am livestreamed service for the month of May. No sign up is required, please bring chairs as you are able, masks must be worn and social distancing maintained. There will be no tent so please check your email for cancellation notification if the weather is bad or call the church and listen for an updated message. If the outdoor service is cancelled, you may watch the livestreamed indoor service on facebook or later on youtube.

Please note: On Tuesday Governor Mills lifted the mask mandate for vaccinated people who are outdoors, unless they are in a crowded setting. A worship service is a crowded setting, so if you are attending outside worship this Sunday please wear a mask, even if you are vaccinated.

If you are planning on attending the outdoor service on Sunday:

- The Congregation will be seated in the parking area by the church.
- Please bring chairs if you are able as we only have 35
- Please walk down to the parking area via the driveway, not the stairs. Ushers will be available for assistance.
- There will be designated handicap parking spots on either side of the driveway entrance.
- Please sign in and make sure you are wearing a mask. See you there!

Sacred Ground: A Film-Based Dialogue on Faith and Race

The National Episcopal Church has created a film-based dialogue series on faith and race called Sacred Ground. Several members of St. Andrew's have participated in this series through the Cathedral.

Suzannah would like to create a dialogue group at St. Andrew's. The group will meet **10 times over 8 months**. The sessions are **90 minutes long**. Between sessions there are reading and video watching assignments.

Suzannah would like to hold a group on 10 Tuesdays from 4-5:30 pm beginning on May 11. There will be 2-4 weeks between meetings. If the weather permits, we will meet outside in the beginning and on Zoom when the weather is not good. It is hoped that eventually the group will be able to meet inside the church building.
