The Poetry of Gerard Manley Hopkins - course begins this Sunday

The Rev. Byron Stuhlman will begin a course on the poetry of Gerard Manley Hopkins after the 10:00am service this Sunday, September 12, and it will meet for five Sundays, ending on October 10. Below is a description of the course. There will be handouts at the first meeting.

Gerard Manley Hopkins, a convert to Roman Catholicism who became a Jesuit priest, is perhaps the most original of the late Victorian English poets. His use of "sprung rhythm" rather than the standard metrical forms of English poetry has had a profound influence on modern poets such as T. S. Eliot, W. H. Auden, and Dylan Thomas. His arresting use of language, his sensitive appreciation of nature, and his religious insight makes him a poet well worth reading. His poems are not easy to read, but well worth the effort. We will look first at some of his best-known nature poems. Then we will at his "terrible sonnets" or poems of desolation, when he struggled with depression during his years in Ireland. We will conclude by looking at his first major poem, "The Wreck of the Deutschland," in many ways his most difficult poem.

St. Andrew's Church services for September, 2021

Sunday, 8:00am - In-person, indoor service of Holy Eucharist, Rite I

There will be no tent so please check your email for cancellation notification if the weather is bad or call the church and listen for an updated message. If the outdoor service is cancelled, you may watch the livestreamed indoor service on facebook or later on youtube.

If you are planning on attending the outdoor service on Sunday:

- The Congregation will be seated in the parking area by the church.
- Please bring chairs if you are able as we only have 35
- Please walk down to the parking area via the driveway, not the stairs. Ushers will be available for assistance.
- There will be designated handicap parking spots on either side of the driveway entrance.
- Please sign in. See you there!

Revised mask policy at St. Andrew's

In light of the rapid spread of the Delta variant of the corona virus and the evidence that vaccinated people can also spread this variant even when asymptomatic, the CDC and the Diocese of Maine is recommending that all people (vaccinated and unvaccinated) wear masks when gathering indoors. The vestry and I communicated via email, and all agreed that we need to return to mask use for all indoor meetings and worship at St. Andrew's.

So, beginning immediately masks are required for all indoor meetings and worship services at St. Andrew's. The vestry will continue to monitor the situation and make changes as necessary.

Sunday Worship - September 12, 2021

<u>Musical Note</u>: Benedetto Giacomo Marcello (1686-1739) was a prolific Italian composer, writer, advocate, magistrate, and teacher. He is known for his 150 psalm settings, which he did not intend for liturgical use, and as such used vernacular Italian instead of Latin. Each psalm was introduced at an academic gathering. Marcello used ancient chants from three Jewish traditions--Ashkenazic, Sephardic, and Levantine. The postlude I will play on Sept. 12 is an arrangement by Alexandre Guilmant of one of Marcello's psalm settings; a setting of Psalm 19 originally scored for alto, tenor, two basses, and basso continuo. -Sean Fleming
