Due to low attendance, we will be temporarily stopping the 10:00am Wednesday Healing service. We will start back on Ash Wednesday (March 2) and continue through Lent.

Music note for Sunday, January 16

In honor of the life and witness of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., I will play several arrangements of spirituals at both services on January 16.

Marques L.A. Garrett, who arranged "Give Me Jesus," was born in 1984 in Hampton, Virginia. He is a magna cum laude graduate of Hampton University, where he conducted various ensembles including the HU Concert Choir and Crusaders Male Chorus. His works have been premiered by the Hampton University Symphonic Chorus, commissioned by the I. Sherman Greene Chorale, and performed by the

Brigham Young University Men's Chorus (*King of Kings*, *Volume 2*, Abbington, 2009).

"Bye and Bye" was arranged by William Farley Smith, 1941-1997. Smith was an authority on spirituals - their origins, history, and use for the church today. His work is represented by a large number of spiritual arrangements in hymnals across all denominations (*King of Kings, Volume 2*, Abbington, 2009).

I arranged "Precious Lord, Take My hand." Dr. King often requested that this hymn be sung at services at which he was preacher, and Mahalia Jackson sang it at his 1968 funeral

Create a great offer by adding words like "free" "personalized" "complimentary" or "customized." A sense of urgency often helps readers take an action, so think about inserting phrases like "for a limited time only" or "only 7 remaining!"
