Benedictines

Studying the Rule of St. Benedict is a jumping off place for those of us who gather weekly to explore many aspects of Christianity and our faith in a very personal way. We begin by reading a Psalm (which we take turns choosing) and discussing how it strikes us at that moment. The most common reaction is amazement at where that conversation can take us, as well as how little human nature has changed over the centuries. We then read a section of a book pertaining to St. Benedict's Rule. These have ranged from simple rephrasing of the actual text to a variety of commentaries, all of which have been enlightening. It is astonishing to find that guidelines written by a man who most wanted to be reclusive in the 4th century can be so pertinent to our lives today. We are always open to others, of any faith, to join us, as we wrestle with matters large and small, with St. Benedict's guidance. - Edie Vaughan
