On **Tuesday**, **October 4 at 11:00am**, we will have an outdoor liturgy to celebrate creation, the life of St. Francis, and to bless the animals who are special in our lives. Please bring your pets (appropriately restrained), or a picture of your pet to be blessed.

#### **Outreach First Sundays**

The Outreach Committee and the Vestry have been working together to re-vamp the way Outreach funds are gathered on the first Sunday of the month, from donations and loose cash in the collection plate. In recent years the first Sunday plate proceeds have been dedicated to the Ecumenical Food Pantry recognizing the vital need it serves for households throughout Lincoln County. At the moment, the Pantry is well funded.

As a result, the Vestry has put into place a new system where a series of seven Outreach partners begin to take turns as First Sunday plate recipients in successive rotation. The succession begins this Sunday with the Ecumenical Council for Homeless Prevention, and continues on future First Sundays with the Trinity Jubilee Center, CHIP Inc., Stepping Stone Housing, Haiti, Habitat for Humanity and the Ecumenical Food Panty. St. Andrew's parishioners are urged to make a donation either by placing cash in the first Sunday plate or by check. Each month we will indicate which organization the check should be made out to.

The October first Sunday recipient is the Ecumenical Council for Homeless Prevention (ECHP). Please make checks payable to Damariscotta Baptist Church with ECHP in the memo line. All checks may be sent to St. Andrew's Church or placed in the offertory plate.

#### About the Ecumenical Council for Homeless Prevention (ECHP)

It is not a coincidence that of the seven designated partners four are directly concerned with housing needs in Lincoln County. That is because there has been a recent surge in evictions, power disconnection and requests for help from people living locally in cars or campers. The Ecumenical Council for Homeless Prevention (ECHP) has seen 16 applicants for housing help at the Help Desk at the Ecumenical Food Pantry in the past four weeks. We have been able to help with paying back rent and CMP arrearages but the ECHP Fund balance has dipped dramatically. If you would like to help in preventing homelessness in Lincoln County, please put a check in this Sunday's collection plate made out to the Damariscotta Baptist Church with ECHP in the memo line.

#### Mask Update

The vestry met on Tuesday, July 19. This is the Vestry Approved COVID-19 Policy as of their meeting. At each monthly meeting of the vestry, the members thoughtfully consider the best practices for St. Andrew's in regards to Masking. The following was approved at this month's vestry meeting, effective immediately: Following the CDC risk categories of green (low transmission)/yellow (moderate transmission)/ red (high transmission)

When Lincoln County is in the green category. Masking in St. Andrew's building is optional for both worship and meetings. We *will sing* during worship.

When Lincoln County is in the yellow category. Masking in St. Andrew's building is optional for both worship and meetings. We *will not sing* during worship.

When Lincoln County is in the red category. Masking in St. Andrew's building is mandatory for both worship and meetings. We *will not sing* during worship.

We will check the status of Lincoln County on Friday mornings.
