Dedication of Bicentennial Chalice and Paten

The Diocese of Maine celebrated its 200th birthday in the year 2020. There were significant changes to the planned celebrations of the Diocesan Bicentennial because of the COVID-19 pandemic. This Sunday, November 20, 2022, the entire diocese will observe a moment of dedication and thanksgiving as they bless their congregation's set of Bicentennial Chalices and Patens, specially commissioned for our celebration.

The chalice and paten sets were made by ceramic artist Stephanie Rozene who wrote:"I believe that the work is not finished until it is in use and in this, I am honored that the work will be finished by everyone in the Diocese of Maine as they take part in the Eucharist. The colors are reminiscent of those that remind me of Maine, blue waters, green of the pines and white porcelain for the preciousness of each life."

This Sunday, as we complete the liturgical year and the three-year lectionary cycle, we present this chalice and paten to be set apart for the service of Christ's holy Church.
