Outreach First Sunday plate recipient: Haiti

St. Andrew's has had a long history supporting Haiti due in large part to the efforts of Susie and Frazier Meade. In addition to supporting Haiti by purchasing items at the many Haitian Art sales we have had, this month we are supporting Haiti as our Outreach First Sunday plate recipient. Frazier Meade writes:

"When you ask Haitians what they value most for their children, the answer is education. St. Andrew's Church has helped support a small school in the village of Figaro, outside the big town of Gros Morne, for nearly twenty five years. Despite the gang violence that has beset Haiti, the Episcopal parish priest, Pere Colbert Estil, has kept the school open and the children learning. Rampant inflation has stripped our ability to feed the children, but they do get a good education."

All plate cash at each service this Sunday will be given to support our mission in Haiti. Lenten Book Discussion

Breathing Under Water
By Richard Rohr
Led by Jeanne Titherington
Starting Sunday, February 28th after the 10am service

Breathing Under Water, by Richard Rohr is the most impactful book on spirituality that I have read in a long, long time. Its insights are meant as a challenge as much as a comfort and are presented to aid in our pursuit of a more fulfilling relationship with Christ.

Father Richard Rohr is a Franciscan priest living in New Mexico and is the founder of the Center of Action and Contemplation. Rohr is also a recovering alcoholic. In *Breathing Under Water*, Rohr uses AA's Twelve Steps as chapter titles and springboards for his essays. However, this is **not** a piece of AA literature. Rather, the book is meant to be a kind of road map for those of us wishing to find and follow the way of Christ.

You will need to purchase your own book (around \$12 in paperback). It is available at the bookstore or online. Please contact Suzannah if the cost is too much for you. The class will be held in the church library.
