
Andrew's will hold the traditional Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. Details will follow next week.

Diocesan Convention delegates and alternates

We are also looking for 4 delegates and two alternates to the Diocesan Convention

The Episcopal Diocese of Maine gathers together annually to conduct the business of our diocese and worship together. The clergy of the diocese along with elected lay delegates from each congregation in Maine are the voting body. In 2023, convention will take place in parts:

<u>Pre-convention Town Hall Gathering</u>s – Tuesdays at 7:00 pm on October 10, 17, 24 and 31 online via Zoom

<u>Diocesan-wide Convocation</u> – Saturday, October 21 from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm at Cathedral of St. Luke. This is for the whole diocese and is not limited to clergy and delegates to convention, and will include worship, fellowship, and discussion.

<u>Annual Convention Business Session</u> – Saturday, November 11 from 9:00-11:30 am online for clergy and lay delegates. This is when voting will take place.

Music Note for this Sunday

The lyrics for "God of grace and God of glory" were written by the prolific 18th century Welsh author

William Williams. In 1904 the hymn was paired with a recently-composed melody by John Hughes, CWM RHONDDA (named after a Welsh valley of the same name). This pairing happened during the religious revival in Wales known as the Great Awakening, and the hymn quickly spread throughout Wales. Many consider the hymn the unofficial national anthem of Wales, and it is often sung at sporting events as well as churches.

"God of grace and God of glory" derives its imagery and narrative directly from the story of the Israelites, led from slavery in Egypt and guided to the Promised Land. Key touchstones from that story are invoked to convey the prayer of just one poor sinner, wishing for God's guidance, trusting in His grace, and offering humble praise. - Sean Fleming

Lenten Book Discussion

Breathing Under Water By Richard Rohr Led by Jeanne Titherington Starting Sunday, February 26th after the 10am service

Breathing Under Water, by Richard Rohr is the most impactful book on spirituality that I have read in a long, long time. Its insights are meant as a challenge as much as a comfort and are presented to aid in our pursuit of a more fulfilling relationship with Christ.

Father Richard Rohr is a Franciscan priest living in New Mexico and is the founder of the Center of Action and Contemplation. Rohr is also a recovering alcoholic. In *Breathing Under Water*, Rohr uses AA's Twelve Steps as chapter titles and springboards for his essays. However, this is **not** a piece of AA literature. Rather, the book is meant to be a kind of road map for those of us wishing to find and follow the way of Christ.

You will need to purchase your own book (around \$12 in paperback). It is available at the bookstore or online. Please contact Suzannah if the cost is too much for you. The class will be held in the church library.
