#### The Bishop Is Coming to St. Andrew's

On Sunday, April 30 at the 10 am service, Bishop Thomas Brown will be making his visitation to St. Andrew's. This is a time for us to worship and talk with him. We will have a festive coffee hour after the 10:00am service.

#### **Foyer Dinner Groups**

We will be forming Foyer dinner groups this year, starting in June. We hope to get as many people involved as possible. The Foyer dinners were a huge success before we had to discontinue them because of Covid, and many of us are looking forward to participating again. The program will be organized by the Vestry this year, in order to keep the whole task from falling onto one or two people. Each individual group will be led by a member of the Vestry, with the overall program being administered by Laurie Gray and Martha Elliott.

For those of you who are not familiar with the Foyer idea, it is, basically, a series of pot-luck suppers hosted by a different household each month. The host usually provides the main dish, as well as the venue (which does'nt necessarily have to be your house), and everybody else brings the rest. Once you've signed up, you'll be put into a group, which you will stay in for the duration (right now, we're anticipating running from June to September), so you really get to know some of your fellow parishioners. In the past, the groups have numbered between eight and ten people. We hope to involve new parishioners, especially, and to make summer people feel that they are a more integral part of the parish.

Sign up sheets will be in the back of the church, and downstairs during coffee hour.

#### St. Andrew's Earthkeepers

First meeting of St. Andrew's Earthkeepers: Sunday, May 7th

In 2022 the Episcopal Diocese of Maine passed a resolution declaring a climate emergency and encouraging the celebration of the Season of Creation. The St. Andrew's Earthkeepers will be the parish's representatives to discern how our congregation will live up to this resolution, create and sign on to a Covenant for the Care of Creation, as well as prepare for and support the celebration of the Season of Creation (September 1-October 4).

Our first meeting will be after the 10:00 service on Sunday, May 7th. To begin with we will meet once a month, but will decide as a group how frequently we need to meet to achieve our goals. Additionally, we will have the opportunity to join other Earthkeepers from around the diocese to discuss our ministry and gain further support.

We look forward to having the Earthkeepers not only engage our congregation in our work, but also look outward to the greater community to live more fully into our calling for environmental justice. Additionally, we want the Earthkeepers to be a resource for our parish committees, the vestry and formational activities.
