## Changes to staffing at St. Andrew's

To summarize, as part of the ongoing effort to reduce the budget deficit, the finance committee recommended that the vestry cut the Christian Formation position and reduce the music program. The vestry decided to make the staff reductions over two years instead of one, for the sake of the people holding these positions. This left us with a deficit, but one which is much more manageable.

- The Christian Formation position will end at the end of June
- The choir will continue as it has before, except they will sing through the second Sunday in June instead of all the Sundays in June. They will resume, as usual, after Labor Day.
- Music at the 8:00am service will be reduced to one Sunday a month

These changes were discussed and agreed upon through meetings with Sherrie, Sean, Linda, John and Suzannah.

On Sunday, May 28, John and Suzannah will be available in the library following the 8 am and 10 am services to answer any questions and hear any concerns you might have. If you can't attend either of these sessions, please feel free to speak to a vestry member, warden or the rector if you have a question or a concern.

Henry Coleman (1888-1965) was an English organist and arranger who held several cathedral posts at Manchester Cathedral and Peterborough Cathedral. His book, *The Amateur Choir Trainer* (1932), reissued in 1964 as *The Church Choir Trainer*, exerted favorable influence on choral groups in the UK and elsewhere. I will play several of his voluntaries on May 21. I will also use one of his alternate harmonizations of Hyfrydol to accompany our singing of the hymn "Alleluia! sing to Jesus."

#### **Foyer Dinner Groups**

We will be forming Foyer dinner groups this year, starting in June. We hope to get as many people involved as possible. The Foyer dinners were a huge success before we had to discontinue them because of Covid, and many of us are looking forward to participating again. The program will be organized by the Vestry this year, in order to keep the whole task from falling onto one or two people. Each individual group will be led by a member of the Vestry, with the overall program being administered by Laurie Gray and Martha Elliott.

For those of you who are not familiar with the Foyer idea, it is, basically, a series of pot-luck suppers hosted by a different household each month. The host usually provides the main dish, as well as the venue (which does'nt necessarily have to be your house), and everybody else brings the rest. Once you've signed up, you'll be put into a group, which you will stay in for the duration (right now, we're anticipating running from June to September), so you really get to know some of your fellow parishioners. In the past, the groups have numbered between eight and ten people. We hope to involve new parishioners, especially, and to make summer people feel that they are a more integral part of the parish.

Sign up sheets will be in the back of the church, and downstairs during coffee hour.
