Music Note for this Sunday, June 25

Bach's Prelude and Fugue in C Major, BWV 545 exists in several versions; some versions include a trio between the prelude and fugue. The music probably was written when Bach lived in Weimar, and further revisions were made when Bach lived in Leipzig.

The toccata-like prelude has three successive long held notes, or pedal points in the pedal, followed by a fourth pedal point complete with a trill in the right hand part.

The fugue starts with a statement of the theme, or subject; and then three more statements in close succession. As the fugue continues, parts in which the subject is not played, called episodes, are interspersed with theme entrances. Some theme entrances are cleverly hidden within inner parts. There are fifteen subject entrances in all, culminating in the final soaring theme entrance in the last six measures. - Sean Fleming

The Courage to Meddle: British Author and Former UK Parliamentarian Tom Levitt to Speak on Frances Perkins

Monday, June 26, 7-8 pm, Undercroft at St. Andrew's Church

A former science teacher, Tom Levitt was a Member of the British Parliament from 1997 to 2010, representing the Labour Party of Tony Blair. Since then, he has worked with businesses, large and small, to promote a more responsible and sustainable economy; he now teaches Sustainability at the University of West London's Business School. On visiting New York's Tenement Museum in 2013 Tom learned of the Triangle Factory Fire and Frances Perkins' subsequent role in campaigning for justice. In 2019 he toured New York state and Maine to research Miss Perkins' story. His biography of her *The Courage to Meddle: The Belief of Frances Perkins* (2020), explores her record from an outsider's perspective and asks how her policies are faring in today's global economy. He explores her webs of connections and the wider impact of America's first female cabinet member. He discovered that he had much in common with Miss Perkins – including a birthday!
