Note about the music for July 16:

The words for hymn number 632 "O Christ, the Word Incarnate" by William Walsham How appeared in the supplement to *Psalms and Hymns* (London, 1867) by How and Thomas Baker Morrell. It is based on Psalm 119:105, "Thy word is a lantern unto my feet and a light unto my path." The tune *Munich* has been associated with the text since the Hutchins music edition in the *The Hymnal, 1892*. The tune has been a popular one since it was used in Felix Mendelssohn's great oratorio *Elijah*.

Our soloist for the Sunday, July 16 10:00 service, bass-baritone **John David Adams**, is an acclaimed concert soloist with repertoire ranging from Baroque masterworks to world-premiere compositions, in appearances with orchestras, choral organizations, and musical ensembles across the country. Based in Nobleboro, he is best known to local audiences through solo engagements with the Sheepscot Valley Chorus, Lincoln Arts Festival, Down East Singers, Tapestry Singers, the Boothbay Opera House, and the Lincoln Theater. His performances this summer include *Messiah* with Down East Singers, *Israel in Egypt* with Blue Hill Bach Festival, Mozart *Coronation Mass* with Lincoln Arts Festival, and the C.P.E. Bach *Magnificat* with White Mountain Bach Festival. He is a regular soloist at the Camden Church of Christ Scientist, and at St. Peter's by the Sea in Cape Neddick. He serves on the voice faculty of Bay Chamber Concerts Music School in addition to maintaining a private voice studio.

Timothy Burris, guitar

Free-will offering at the door to benefit St. Andrew's Community Outreach program

Plucked-string specialist Timothy Burris will bring a program of 19th- and early 20th-century music for classical guitar at several venues over the Summer and early Fall. The program will include works of Spanish guitarist/composers from Julian Arcas to Francisco Tárrega (from the region of Almería) to several composers from Cataluña (José Ferrer, José Viñas, Jaume Bosch i Renard, and the best known, Miguel Llobet). Mr Burris will sketch the cultural milieu that gave rise to this hotbed of creative fervor for the guitar—and the arts in general.

The guitar used in the program will be a modern copy of Antonio Torres' FE17 (built for Mr Burris by Richard Berg of Ottawa). The original was completed in 1864 and given by Torres to a young but promising Francisco Tárrega, from whose hands it eventually passed to the young but preternaturally gifted Argentinian, Maria Anido.

Timothy Burris has performed widely on lute and guitar in Europe and the US, including many appearances with world-renowned early music specialists. Regionally, he is the lutenist of BOOM, the Baroque Orchestra of Maine; he and cellist Raffael Scheck appear as the duo ScheckMate.

Mr Burris holds a soloist's diploma from the Royal Conservatory in The Hague, where he studied with the world-renowned lutenist Toyohiko Satoh and the Uruguayan guitarist Antonio Pereira-Arias (who himself studied with Andrés Segovia). He also holds a PhD from Duke University (his dissertation focused on the use of lute and theorbo in ensemble vocal music at the Dresden court).
