The Rev. Rebecca Grant to preach this Sunday, July 9

The Rev. Rebecca Grant Deacon at St. Luke's Cathedral, will be joining us at both of services on July 9 to preach and teach us about the ministry of deacons in the Episcopal Church.

There are three distinct orders of ordained ministry in the Episcopal Church: deacons, presbyters (priests), and bishops). In the Episcopal Church a deacon exercises "a special ministry of servanthood" directly under the supervision of the bishop, serving all people and especially those in need (BCP, p. 543). This reflects the practice of the early church where deacons where ordained to the servanthood of the bishop (Hippolytus, Apostolic Tradition).

The term *diakonos*, in the ancient Greek-speaking world, meant an intermediary who acted or spoke for a superior, thus deacons were agents of the bishop who were often given oversight of charity. Since ancient times, during worship, deacons have proclaimed (read) the gospel, lead intercessions (prayers), served at the eucharistic table, and sent the assembly out into the world (dismissal).

For many years, the order of deacons as a permanent vocation was not recognized in the Anglican and Episcopal Church. In the twentieth century the order was revived with an emphasis on social care and service. Many bishops expect their deacons to promote care of the needy outside the church.

You also may have heard of "transitional deacons" who are ordained deacon as a preliminary step toward ordination as a priest. This practice is required by the canons of the Episcopal Church, but its theology and usefulness has been questioned by those who favor direct ordination to the priesthood.

Please join me in welcoming Rebecca to St. Andrew's this Sunday.
