Supply clergy

There will be supply clergy at both St. Andrew's services on the Sundays that Suzannah is away. The Rev. Karen Johnson will preach and celebrate on August 20 and September 3 and The Rev. John Van Siclen will preach and celebrate on August 27.

Wednesday Healing Service

The Wednesday Healing service will not be held on 8/23 and 8/30 while Suzannah is on vacation.

Note about the music for August 20:

The four short chorale preludes we hear this morning on "Allein Gott in der Höh sei Ehr" (All Glory be to God on High), exemplify the extensive influence of 16th century (and earlier) German hymn tunes on the sacred organ and choral repertoire still used in our worship liturgy today. Church organists of the Baroque period composed music for worship based on the familiar hymn tunes of the time.

Friedrich Wilhelm Zachau (1663-1712), a distinguished German organist, was one of the leading composers of church cantatas and keyboard works of his day. He was a noted teacher, numbering Handel among his pupils. Andreas Nicolaus Vetter (1666-1734) was a German organist who studied with Johann Pachelbel. Regrettably, only a small number of his compositions survive, most having been destroyed during World War II. Johann Gottfried Walther (1684-1748) was a German music theorist, organist and composer. He was city organist of Weimar during which time he wrote 132 organ preludes based on Lutheran chorale melodies. J. S. Bach (1685-1750) is the most well-known and prolific of the Baroque composers of chorale preludes. - Brent Douglass

The Mass in C Major "Coronation Mass," composed in 1779, is

one of the most popular of Mozart's 17 settings of the Latin mass texts. It most likely premiered on Easter Sunday in 1779 in Salzburg Cathedral. The soloists for this marvelous work will be soprano Mary Sullivan, mezzo-soprano Jenna Guiggey, tenor David Myers-Wakeman, and bass-baritone John David Adams.

As a special treat, David Myers-Wakeman will sing two arrangements of hits from The Platters, including "Smoke Gets In Your Eyes" and "The Great Pretender." Several shorter pieces will also be featured on the program, including arrangements of "Blue Skies," "In The Still Of The Night," "It Don't Mean A Thing," "Mister Sandman," "Over the Rainbow," and more.

Tickets are \$25 and are available online at <u>lincolnartsfestival.org</u> or at Sherman's Maine Coast Book Shop in Boothbay Harbor. They may also be purchased at the door starting 30 minutes prior to each performance.
