Holy Women, Holy Men Hannah More Religious Writer, Abolitionist, and Philanthropist

On almost every day of the year, the Episcopal Church honors faithful followers of Jesus who went before us. Every Wednesday at St. Andrew's during our Healing Eucharist, we remember one of more of these Holy Men and Women. We take time to remember these people for three important reasons. First, they deserve to be remembered. The people chosen for our calendar are remembered because they were particularly remarkable followers of Jesus. The second reason we remember them is because in remembering we are connected to Christians throughout time. And last but not least, we remember them because in remembering we can learn how to be better followers of Jesus in our day and time.

Note about the music for September 10:

A big thanks to Brent Douglass for playing for services in August and September 3. It's nice to have a St. Andrew's parishioner whom I can rely on when I'm on vacation.

For the prelude on September 10, I will play "Rolling On" by Paul Halley. Halley is a Canadian composer and keyboardist who was the organist and choirmaster at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York from 1977 to 1989, and a member of the Paul Winter Consort for many years. About "Rolling On," Halley wrote "I improvised the seed of this piece at a sound check for our Carnival show at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in 1988. Paul Winter loved it, and it developed into a short piano solo." The postlude that I will play on September 10 was composed by Paul Fey, a 25-year-old composer and organist from Leipzig, Germany. Fey made his United States debut this year in June at the Methuen

Memorial Music Hall, as well as playing concerts in Pennsylvania, New York, D.C., and North Carolina. Some of his recordings can be found on his YouTube channel at <u>youtube.com/PaulFey</u>. - Sean Fleming

Upcoming Concert this Sunday, September 10th

<u>Sean Fleming and his Red Hot Peppers band</u> will play Dixieland and ragtime on <u>Sunday, September 10, at 3 p.m.</u> at the Searsport First Congregational Church, 8 Church St. Included will be pieces originally played by "Jelly Roll" Morton, Louis Armstrong, Scott Joplin, the New Orleans Rhythm Kings, and more. Such early Dixieland-style hits as "The Chant," "Black Bottom Stomp," "Tiger Rag," and more will be played. Come tap your feet as the band plays hits from the dawn of the jazz age.

The Red Hot Peppers band for this concert will include the same instrumental configuration that "Jelly Roll" Morton used in his trend-setting Red Hot Peppers in the 1920s; with Sean Fleming on piano, Phil Clement on banjo and guitar, Glen Sargent on clarinet, Allen Millett on drums, Doug Kennedy on trombone and double bass, Peter Stuart on trumpet, and Anne-Marie D'Amico on tuba. This concert is sure to be a favorite for people of all ages! Plan to come early to guarantee your seating; admission is by donation at the door, with proceeds to go to the FCC Church and Community music programs, and to help defray the cost of the concert series. All are welcome!
