Guilmant's first organ sonata was one of two sonatas that Guilmant later arranged for orchestra. I will play the second movement at the 10:00 service this Sunday, October 22. This movement is based around a melody that begins with an ascending scale in the right hand and is then echoed in the left hand. The melody recurs at various points throughout the movement, played on various manuals, with varying tonal colors. - Sean Fleming
