We will make sure there is coffee. If even a dozen of us remember to bring our dozen cookies, we will get to enjoy each others'

company after the service with a minimum of fuss, a delicious nibble, and all the joy of the Christmas season.

Music for the 4 Advent service, this Sunday, December 24 at 10:00am

For the fourth Sunday of Advent, we have the option to read or sing the canticle known as the *Magnificat* or the Song of Mary. The text of the canticle is taken directly from the Gospel of Luke (1:46–55) where it is spoken by Mary upon the occasion of her Visitation to her cousin Elizabeth. In the narrative, after Mary greets Elizabeth, who is pregnant with John the Baptist, the latter moves within Elizabeth's womb. Elizabeth praises Mary for her faith (using words partially reflected in the Hail Mary), and Mary responds with the *Magnificat*.

No other musical text has been set to music more than the *Magnificat*. In Gregorian chant there were originally eight tunes or tones to which the *Magnificat* was sung. Later there were four more tones added. I will play a setting by Bach of the ninth of these *Magnificat* tones, called the *tonus peregrinus*. This tone is the one usually sung to Martin Luther's translation of the *Magnificat* text, and the one we will chant at the 10:00 service on Dec. 24. -Sean Fleming
