Music for the 1 Christmas service, this Sunday, December 31 at 10:00am

The poem "Love came down at Christmas" was originally published by the English poet Christina Rossetti (1830-1894) in *Time Flies: a Reading Diary* (1885). The tune in *The Hymnal 1982* is an old Irish tune first printed in *The Complete Collection of Irish Music as Noted by George Petrie* (1902-1905). Another poem by Christina Rossetti, "In the bleak midwinter," was published, under the title "A Christmas Carol," in the January 1872 issue of *Scribner's Monthly*, and was first collected in book form in *Goblin Market, The Prince's Progress and Other Poems* (1875). -Sean Fleming

Lessons and Carols for Peace: Sunday, January 7 at 10 AM

The great message of the Christmas Season is "Peace on Earth." We want this peace, but find ourselves more often than not in the midst of war--war between nations, war between political parties, war with each other, war with ourselves. As we begin this New Year and gather to celebrate the Epiphany and the end of the Christmas Season, let us gather in worship to reflect upon and pray for peace in the world, in our nation, and in our individual lives.

At the 10:00am service on January 7th, we will have a service of Lessons and Carols for Peace with Eucharist. Our readings and music will all focus on peace. The Service was created by The Rev. Rob Voyle and was first used at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Portland, Oregon in 2003.

There will also be a traditional 8:00am service of Holy Eucharist Rite I with music on Sunday, January 7.
