

### Music Note for this Sunday, March 17

The text of hymn number 709 in *The Hymnal 1982* ("O God of Bethel") by Philip Doddridge first appeared in the 1871 edition of the (Episcopal) *Hymnal*. The tune perhaps first appeared in the early seventeenth-century Scottish psalter, *The CL Psalmes of David* (Edinburgh, 1615). The tune was originally designated as *French Tune*, the preferred name still in use in Scottish hymnals. -Sean Fleming
