### Music Note for this Sunday, March 10

The lyrics for "Come, thou fount" were written by the 18th century pastor and hymn composer Robert Robinson in 1757. The origin of the tune, however, is uncertain.

From William J. Reynolds, Companion to Baptist Hymnal (1976):

"Nettleton first appeared as a two-part tune in John Wyeth's *Repository of Sacred Music, Part Second* (1813, p. 112), where it was named "Hallelujah." In the Index it is identified as a new tune, and no composer's name is given. The tune has been attributed to some to Asahel Nettleton (1783-1844), a well-known evangelist of the early nineteenth century, who compiled *Village Hymns* (1825). However, this compilation contained no music, and there is no evidence that Nettleton wrote any tunes during his life . . . It is not known where the tune name first appeared or who was responsible for it." (pp. 53-54) The tune may have been written by John Wyeth himself. -Sean Fleming
