Founded in 1996 by virtuoso soloist and pedagogue Daniel Heifetz, The Heifetz International Music Institute is known for its Heifetz Performance and Communication Training a unique approach to music training, education, and presentation. The tour is under the direction of the Institute's Artistic Director, violinist Nicholas Kitchen of the New England Conservatory and the Borromeo String Quartet, and the Institute's President and CEO, Benjamin Roe.

The Institute is a non-profit organization dedicated to the artistic growth and career development of the most talented and promising young string players in the world. Through intensive instrumental study and

innovative Performance & Communication Training, the highly-selective Institute guides young musicians to convey the emotion of the music they're performing, explore their full creative potential, express their individuality, and redefine the concert experience. The Institute is held on the campus of Mary Baldwin University, located in Staunton, Va., for six weeks each summer. Heifetz On Tour, the Institute's National Program of Outreach and Career Development, consists of year-round concerts and residencies throughout the country, forming partnerships with school systems and cultural institutions in both major cities and rural areas.

Evening Prayer Service at St. John's Church, Dresden

On Sunday, May 19th at 5 pm, the community is invited to attend a special service at St. John's. It's founding pastor was the Rev. Jacob Bailey, serving from 1761 to 1778. In local historical reenactments of the period, Rev. Bailey is portrayed by the Rev. Paul Tunkle, a local Episcopal priest. In this service of Evening Prayer, Rev. Bailey will lead worship from the English Prayer Book of 1662.

The service will include music, hymns, scripture readings, a homily and prayers for various concerns. It should conclude in about 40 minutes. A reception will follow in the church vestibule.

This service is sponsored by the Dresden Recreation Committee with support from members of St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Wiscasset. Step back in time and honor our past. All are welcome.
