Note about the music for June 9 at 10:00am

The lyrics for "God of grace and God of glory" were written by the prolific 18th century Welsh author Williams. In 1904 the hymn was paired with a recently-composed melody by John Hughes, CWM

RHONDDA (named after a Welsh valley of the same name). This pairing happened during the religious revival in Wales known as the Great Awakening, and the hymn quickly spread throughout Wales. Many consider the hymn the unofficial national anthem of Wales, and it is often sung at sporting events as well as churches.

"God of grace and God of glory" derives its imagery and narrative directly from the story of the Israelites, led from slavery in Egypt and guided to the Promised Land. Key touchstones from that story are invoked to convey the prayer of just one poor sinner, wishing for God's guidance, trusting in His grace, and offering humble praise. - Sean Fleming

Beetle colony release at St. Andrew's Church

Brad Weigel, from Coastal Rivers Conservation, was at St Andrews on Saturday, June 1, for the release of a colony of beetles on the large diseased Hemlock tree. To combat a recently observed infestation of the Hemlock Woolly Adelgid, the property committee explored several possible solutions and finally decided on a course of action that involved releasing a colony of beetles (100) into the hemlocks. (See photos below). The beetle's only source of food is the Woolly Adelgid. Time will tell if this treatment proves successful. Big thanks to Sally Pearce for coordinating this project. CLYNK Program

What is CLYNK? It is an easy way to turn in your redeemable bottles and drink cans and benefit St. Andrew's at the same time. Pick up a green CLYNK bag from the basket in the Atrium. Take it home and fill it (not too heavy please) with your redeemable bottles and cans. When it's about half full, take it to Hannaford's Redemption room, just to the left as you enter the store. Use the bar code scanner to scan the sticker on your bag. This will send the credit to St. Andrew's CLYNK account. The money earned from this will go to the Earth Keepers group for environmental awareness and projects in the parish. Thank you!
