Weekly Wednesday service and lunch

St. Andrew's has a number of parishioners who are no longer able to drive, and therefore are not able to

be with us on Sunday mornings but are still a vital part of our community. In order to provide in person worship for more people, I am exploring moving the Wednesday service to 11:30 am and holding a lunch following the service in the Atrium. This is likely a better start time for those for whom getting up and going in the morning takes some time. (we would order sandwiches, provide drinks and take a freewill collection)

I would like to hear from you if you are someone who would like a ride to this service and luncheon. I would also like to hear from those who would be willing to be drivers for those who can no longer drive. The goal would be to create a rota large enough that no one is on call to drive every week. I would imagine the time commitment would be about 2 1/2 hours from pick up to drop off. You could stay for the service and lunch or leave and come back at 1 pm.

And of course, anyone would be welcome to come to the service and the luncheon, even if you are not able to be a driver or are able to drive yourself. The service is a Eucharist with a short sermon and healing prayers at the altar for those who wish to receive them for themselves or someone they love.

Lay Eucharistic Visitors

Sometimes, due to illness, infirmity or age, members of our parish are not able to attend church in person, but church does not have to happen in the actual church. Communion can be brought to those who are unable to come out to worship. As a priest, I bring communion to many of these members and to those experiencing hospitalization but you do not have to be a priest to bring communion to members of the parish. Lay people can be licensed as Lay Eucharistic Visitors (LEV). With a little bit of training in the ministry and the completion of Diocesan safe church training, any member of St. Andrew's can become a LEV.

St. Andrew's has had Lay Eucharistic Visitors in the past but the ministry has been dormant for a few years. I would like to restart this ministry. I believe there are members of this parish who are called to this ministry. The time commitment would be a once a year in person training, yearly safe church training, and one Sunday a month visit to someone who would like to receive communion. My aim would be to have enough visitors that everyone who would like to receive communion at home would have a visitor once a month.

Music Note for Sunday, August 25 at 10am

Dietrich Buxtehude (1637-1707) is one of the best-known composers of the Baroque period. Like his contemporary, J. S. Bach, who was almost 50 years younger, Buxtehude was not only a prolific composer but also a devout churchman. He composed numerous organ and cantata compositions, many of which were settings of German (particularly Lutheran) hymns, establishing his central role in the development of Protestant Baroque music. At age 31, Buxtehude was appointed organist at the Marienkirche in Lubeck, one of the biggest churches in Germany, a position he held until his retirement. The chorale melody, 'Herzlich tut mich verlangen,' a contemplative work, written as a spiritual song for the dying during a time of plague, was later applied to the text which we know as 'O sacred head, sore wounded'. 'Komm, Heiliger Geist, Herre Gott' (Come, Holy Ghost, Lord God) is a Lutheran hymn for Pentecost, published in 1524. Martin Luther's chorale, 'Ein feste Burg ist unser Gott' (A mighty Fortress is our God) is a paraphrase of Psalm 46. Buxtehude's setting is highly decorated, while the simple three-voice accompaniment uses small extracts of the chorale tune. - Brent Douglass
