Note about the music for this Sunday

The words for hymn number 632 "O Christ, the Word Incarnate" by William Walsham How appeared in the supplement to *Psalms and Hymns* (London, 1867) by How and Thomas Baker Morrell. It is based on Psalm 119:105, "Thy word is a lantern unto my feet and a light unto my path." The tune *Munich* has been associated with the text since the Hutchins music edition in the *The Hymnal*, 1892. The tune has been a popular one since it was used in Felix Mendelssohn's great oratorio *Elijah*. -Sean Fleming
