A Message from the Rita McKinney, member of the Stewardship Committee

Three initial impressions of St. Andrew's have become very real and meaningful to me over the last ten years.

The warm welcome of St. Andrew's is much more than a sincere greeting before Sunday services. Early on, we were encouraged (by Brett and Priscilla Donham) to attend coffee. We've gone regularly since then. We've met so many interesting, engaging and caring people who have enriched our lives. St. Andrew's welcome extends to many outside organizations, such as AA, that meet and use our church spaces on a regular basis. Recently, our vestry happily welcomed and gave candy to over 300 trick-ortreaters on Halloween.

We are challenged by the plaque on our wall honoring Frances Perkins. The example she set of trying to better our community is reflected in how St. Andrew's cares for its neighbors. A few years ago, our members generously provided sizeable financial support for two boys from Beirut to attend Lincoln Academy. On the first Sunday of each month, our collection plate cash is given to 7 Outreach Partners. In the coming Advent season, St. Andrew's parishioners will ring bells downtown to raise money for local nonprofits.

And the message of the prayer at our church door resonates in our weekly services. In part it reads: "God, make the door of this house wide enough to receive all those who need human love, fellowship, and your care, and narrow enough to shut out envy, pride and hate. Make its threshold smooth enough to be inviting to children or straying feet, but rugged enough to turn back the tempter's power..." Suzannah's sermons, our sacred liturgy and our beautiful music remind us, inspire us, challenge us and guide us throughout the week to shun envy, pride and hate and to give love, fellowship and care to all.

Each of us is impacted in different ways by different aspects of St. Andrew's. Our stewardship campaign is a way to show our thanks for the many aspects of St. Andrew's that we each hold dear.
