#### Note about the music for December 8 at 10am

Johann Ludwig Krebs (baptized 1713-1780) was a German Baroque musician and composer who wrote many works for the pipe organ. Krebs was a favorite organ student of Johann Sebastian Bach.

On December 8 I will feature a fantasia that Krebs wrote on the hymn tune "Psalm 42." This tune is used for hymn number 67 ("Comfort, comfort ye my people") in The Hymnal 1982. This tune is also known by the older title "Freu dich sehr, o meine Seele."

**This Sunday's anthem**, "People, Look East," sets the well-known poetry of Eleanor Farjeon. Commissioned by St. Andrew's Church, the anthem was composed by parishioner Richard Francis, who wrote the organ part with Sean Fleming in mind! Since its debut at St. Andrew's, "People, Look East" has become the traditional opening of the St. Cecilia Chamber Choir Lessons and Carols concerts. ## HAITI

For those who contributed to this spring's Lincoln County Ecumenical Committee for Haiti's money raiser for Gros Morne, Haiti, our friends there have sent a report on how they allocated the \$13,000 we raised. \$3,000 went to a homeless shelter for food and medical care; \$3,000 each went to a Catholic and an Episcopal school (run by our partner priest) for school lunches; \$3,000 to a Catholic school for teachers' salaries, and \$1,000 went to help families displaced by violence. The good news is that the schools are functioning well there. The bad news is that food prices in Haiti are very high because of gang extortions and gang violence has come to the outskirts of Gros Morne. Our friends in Gros Morne thank us for our help and send their blessings. Frazier Meade
