Music Note for Sunday

Philipp Nicolai (1556-1608) wrote both words and music to two of the most famous Lutheran chorales, "Wie schön leuchtet der Morgenstern" ("How brightly beams the morning star") and "Wachet auf, ruft uns die Stimme" ("Wake, awake, for night is flying"). These two chorales have been the basis for several Bach cantatas, countless organ pieces, and other musical works.

Nicolai was not a professional musician. He was a Lutheran pastor at Unna in Westphalia, serving a parish of several thousand people. While he was there, the great plague struck, devastating the population. Many hundreds died over a short time. Nicolai conducted dozens of funerals and comforted countless grieving families

According to John Julian's Dictionary of Hymnology, Nicolai wove an acrostic into each of these two hymns. The first letter of each stanza in the original German is W E G U H Z W, which stands for "Wilhelm Ernst, Graf und Herr zu Waldeck." Wilhelm was one of the victims of the plague. He was the 15-year-old son of the local countess, and Pastor Nicolai was the boy's tutor. These two monumental chorales were written as meditations in memory of Wilhelm. -Sean Fleming
