Note about the music for this Sunday, February 2

The tune for hymn 517 ("How lovely is thy dwelling-place") that we will be singing at both services on Feb. 2 was composed by Scottish minister and composer James Leith Macbeth Bain. This tune, which became known as *Brother James' Air*, was paired with Psalm 23 and first appeared in Bain's collection *The great peace: being a New Year's greeting to our motherland and the nations at present in conflict and a welcome to them all to the feast of the great peace*. This collection was published in 1915, just after the start of the First World War.

For the prelude a beautiful setting of the same tune by English composer Harold Darke (1888-1976), who is well known for his setting of the Christina Rossetti poem In *The Bleak Midwinter*. - - - Sean Fleming
