Note about Sunday's Anthem

"Lord, for Thy Tender Mercy's Sake" sets a text from *Christian Prayers and Holy Meditations* (1586), collected by Henry Bull. The anthem is one of the most beloved English motets, yet it's not possible to identify its composer. The most likely candidates are Richard Farrant (c. 1525–1580) and John Hilton the elder (1565-1609(?)), though Farrant most frequently is credited with its composition. A simple yet expressive work, the anthem exemplifies the clarity and warmth of early Anglican choral music. The soaring "Amen" which concludes the work is not always included, as it was a later addition, composer unknown. —Linda Blanchard

Sunday Lenten Series continues through Lent

Please join me (Suzannah) during the Sundays of Lent following the 10 am service to discuss Bishop Mariann Budde's book, *How We Learn to Be Brave: Decisive Moments in Life and Faith* Bishop Budde is the Bishop of the Diocese of Washington (DC) who preached about mercy at the prayer service in the National Cathedral (Episcopal) in Washington DC following the inauguration of the president. We will read a chapter each week for the six weeks of Lent.

Here is the write up about Bishop Budde's book:

How We Learn to Be Brave is an inspirational guide to the key junctures in life that, if navigated with faith and discernment, pave the way for us to become our most courageous selves, by the bishop of the famed Episcopal Diocese of Washington, D.C.

The Lenten Series will be held after the 10am service and will continue through Lent. The book is available on Amazon and may be available at area bookstores or libraries. There is also a copy of the book in the church library which may be signed out.

4:00pm on the last Saturday of each month, starting March 29th:

I would like to invite you all to a monthly gathering to practice Lectio Terra, or Terra Divina, which invites all to find the divine in the greater-than-human world. The ancient practice of Lectio Divina uses a scripture reading to find greater meaning. In our practice we will have a short reading which we will use for meditation. We then will immerse ourselves in our surroundings to read the natural world around us, hoping to find greater meaning and divinity.

Sessions will last 45-90 minutes depending on the weather or other factors, though most sessions will be about 90 minutes. The first session will be *March 29th, at 4:00.* We will meet every last Saturday

indefinitely. I am also open to other days, which can be in addition to these gatherings.

The first session will be at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, and will include a scripture reading, though this will be an ecumenical group, so we can expand to other venues and readings as we continue our journey together.
