#### Single 9am Service to begin this Sunday, May 4

Just a reminder that we begin our six month trial this Sunday, May 4th with one service at 9:00am. Through this period, we will be celebrating with Holy Eucharist Rite I on the first Sunday of each month and Rite II the rest of the Sundays in the month. There will be music every Sunday.

#### Parking

We recognize that one challenge we may face is parking for those with limited mobility. We need to reserve the spaces in the lower lot for those who cannot walk up and down the hill. Please do not park in those spaces if you are able to navigate the hill. There are four spaces available in that lot, so we also ask you to park in a way that four spaces are available facing the river. There is also one spot parallel to the road in the lower lot that will be reserved for drop off and pick up only. Please do not park there. We will have vestry members and ushers keeping a look out to see if anyone needs any assistance. If you need a space in the lower lot, and none are available, please do not go home. We have people willing to park your car for you in one of the upper spaces.

As with any new endeavor, there will be adjustments that need to be made. Please let me or a member of the vestry know if something needs to be adjusted, particularly if it involves issues of accessibility.

# **Coffee Hour Reimagined**

Our after-church series of get-togethers needs a name and a shape. 'Tidings' is a possibility both for the meaning, good tidings, tidings of great joy, important tidings, etc. and also for the rhythm of the tide that is so much a part of our riverbank home. #### Note about the music for May 4:

The tune for our opening hymn on May 4, TRURO, was first published in Thomas Williams' *Psalmodia Evangelica*, (second vol., 1789) as a setting for Isaac Watts' "Now to the Lord a noble song." Brian Wren adopted this tune for a hymn he wrote in Hockley, Essex, England, during April of 1968. Wren wrote this about his text:

It was written for Easter Sunday, two weeks after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. I could not let Easter go by without speaking of this tragic event which was on all our minds...The hymn tries to see God's love winning over tragedy and suffering in the world. -Sean Fleming
