Music Note for Sunday, May 25

The hymn 417 "This is the Feast" was written by Lutheran pastor and professor John W. Arthur as a paraphrase of passages found in Revelation 5:12-13 and 19:5-9. It was written to take the place of the Gloria in excelsis. The hymn has the form of a responsorial psalm, with each stanza followed by the antiphon.

The tune FESTIVAL CANTICLE was composed for use with the "This is the feast" text by Richard Hillert in 1969. Hymnwriter Carl P. Daw Jr., commented on this setting:

Much of the success of this setting is doubtless owed to the composer's use of a responsorial style that allows for the stanzas to be sung by small groups or soloists, with the congregation joining in on the refrain. The higher register of the refrain's opening calls forth a greater level of energy when it comes round again. (Sources: *The Hymnal 1982 Companion: Volume Three B*, Raymond F. Single 9am Sunday Service

From May through October, St. Andrew's will be trying out a single 9am Sunday service. Through this period, we will be celebrating with Holy Eucharist Rite I on the first Sunday of each month and Rite II the rest of the Sundays in the month with music every Sunday.

Parking

We recognize that one challenge we may face is parking for those with limited mobility. We need to reserve the spaces in the lower lot for those who cannot walk up and down the hill. Please do not park in those spaces if you are able to navigate the hill. There are four spaces available in that lot, so we also ask you to park in a way that four spaces are available facing the river. There is also one spot parallel to the road in the lower lot that will be reserved for drop off and pick up only. Please do not park there. We will have vestry members and ushers keeping a look out to see if anyone needs any assistance. If you need a space in the lower lot, and none are available, please do not go home. We have people willing to park your car for you in one of the upper spaces.

As with any new endeavor, there will be adjustments that need to be made. Please let me or a member of the vestry know if something needs to be adjusted, particularly if it involves issues of accessibility.
