Thank you to John David Adams for his offering of music for the Sunday, July 6 service. Adams is a professional bass-baritone and voice teacher based in Midcoast Maine. His performing career spans concert, opera, recital, and award-winning ensembles, with repertoire ranging from Baroque masterworks to world-premiere compositions. He has appeared with orchestras, opera companies, choral organizations, and musical ensembles across the country, and throughout Maine and New England. He is active as a church soloist, and in addition to being a featured guest he holds regular positions with St. Peter's-by-the-Sea in Cape Neddick and the First Church Christ Scientist in Camden. He serves on the voice faculty of Bay Chamber Music School in Camden, and maintains a private voice studio at home.

Stepping Stone Housing is the recipient of today's loose plate offerings. SSH was founded in 2013 to address the need for affordable housing in Damariscotta and neighboring communities. SSH receives no government funding, but instead relies on donations to make up the difference between what renters can afford and what it costs to keep the properties going. SSH also maintains a facility on Biscay Road where they store and sell donated items to raise money for housing. Please support their work generously.
