Note about the music for this Sunday, August 17

The postlude this Sunday, Trumpet Tune in D (1962), requested by a St. Andrews parishioner, was composed by David N. Johnson (1922–1987), an American organist, composer, and choral conductor, and is the opening and closing theme music for the weekly National Public Radio show With Heart and Voice. Dr. Johnson's Trumpet Tune was also the first of two processionals used for the 1971 wedding of Richard Nixon's Daughter, Tricia, who was married in the White House Rose Garden.

Johnson was college organist and organ instructor from 1960 until 1967 at St Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota where organist and former St. Andrews parishioner Jay Zoller now resides. Johnson taught at Arizona State University from 1969 until his death in 1987. He published well over 300 compositions, most of them for church use, including the music for Earth and All Stars, Hymn 412 in our 1982 Hymnal. - Brent Douglass
