#### Care of Creation - The month of September (and beyond)

Beginning Sunday, September 7 and continuing through September, the bulletin will have a new look as we celebrate the Season of Creation. The Maine Eucharistic Prayer was written by Martin L. Smith for use in the Diocese of Maine and will be used in our September Sunday services. Are you curious about how the new Eucharistic Prayer for the Diocese of Maine came to be? The Rev. Martin L. Smith, who developed the prayer at the request of Bishop Brown and owns the copyright, led a discussion at the summer chapel of All Saints-by-the Sea on Southport Island, where he served earlier this month. #### Note about the music for this Sunday, September 14

Walter Chambers Smith, a Scottish preacher, wrote "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise" in 1867. Ordained to the ministry in the Free Church of Scotland, he pastored a church in London, then preached for almost forty years in Edinburgh.

The hymn is based on I Timothy 1:17, which is included in the second reading for Sept. 14 ("To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible..."), and draws from other Scriptural references as well. "The Ancient of Days" from stanza one is from Daniel 7:9. "Thy justice like mountains" from stanza two is from Psalm 36:6

"Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise" was paired with the old Welsh tune St. Denio and first published in *Hymns of Christ and Christian Life* in 1876. -Sean Fleming
