## **Sunday Worship Service**

Following extensive and considered discussions, the vestry has reached a unanimous decision to reinstate our two worship services: 8am (Rite I, a quiet service without music) and 10am (Rite II, with music), commencing on the first Sunday of Advent (November 30), which marks the beginning of the Church year. The vestry expresses appreciation for your valuable feedback during the single-service trial, provided through emails, surveys, and open forums. We will continue to seek opportunities for the entire congregation to gather at special joint events throughout the year.

The timing of implementation on the first Sunday of Advent allows adequate notice for the public and enables necessary adjustments to scheduling. In preparation, we will be recruiting additional volunteers to serve as Altar Guild, Ushers, Lay Readers, and Eucharistic Ministers. We encourage you to thoughtfully consider participating in one of these ministries.

Please join Suzannah in the sanctuary after the service on Sunday, November 16, for Eucharistic Minister training. It is open to all who would like to become Eucharistic Ministers and as a refresher for those currently involved in this ministry.

#### Note about the music for November 16

The words for hymn number 632 "O Christ, the Word Incarnate" by William Walsham How appeared in the supplement to *Psalms and Hymns* (London, 1867) by How and Thomas Baker Morrell. It is based on Psalm 119:105, "Thy word is a lantern unto my feet and a light unto my path." The tune *Munich* has been associated with the text since the Hutchins music edition in the *The Hymnal*, 1892. The tune has been a popular one since it was used in Felix Mendelssohn's great oratorio *Elijah*.
