## Lenten Friends for 2026: a practice of thankfulness, February 18-April 5

Lenten Friends is a secret pal-style practice for Lent. It involves getting paired with a person for Lent and writing a note to that person each week, (as faithfully as you can) letting them know you are thinking of them and include something you have noticed that week that made you see God in your world.

Those interested should either fill out a slip of paper, available in the atrium, with your name, address and phone number, and place it in the Lenten Friend box or you may send your address and phone number via email to Lili Pugh. The deadline to be included is Shrove Tuesday (February 17th). Names will be paired and you will be contacted by email or phone on Ash Wednesday (February 18th).

*Don't reveal yourself to your Lenten Friend until Easter (April 5th). If you want to get a little gift for them for Easter that is fine, but it should be just a token. Maybe make it a gift of joy you want to share!*


