Lenten Friends for 2026: a practice of thankfulness, February 18-April 5

Lenten Friends is a secret pal-style practice for Lent. It involves getting paired with a person for Lent and writing a note to that person each week, (as faithfully as you can) letting them know you are thinking of them and include something you have noticed that week that made you see God in your world.
