The slate of vestry candidates has gone out in the mail today along with a cover page, ballot and proposed revisions to St. Andrew's Church By-Laws. Please read over the information, review the candidates, sign the cover letter and vote on the enclosed ballot. If there are two members in your household who are eligible to vote, each of you can sign on the cover page but each of you should vote on a separate ballot. Please return the signature page and the ballot(s) to the church by Saturday, February 13. You may mail the ballot as long as it is at the post office by 2/13 (not postmarked by 2/13). There will also be a box in the outside covered vestibule of the church where you may drop off the papers or you may bring them to the church office Tuesday-Thursday, 10am-3pm. (Please call ahead if you do not have a church key and we will have the door unlocked)

You do not have to have an account on Facebook to watch the service this way. Simply search for "St. Andrew's Newcastle Facebook" and you will find the page. You can watch it without an account. The service will also be saved, and you can watch it at another time on Facebook or on the St. Andrew's YouTube page.

We are providing consecrated hosts for you to pick up and have in your home. You can consume these hosts at the appropriate time while you are viewing the livestreamed celebration of the Holy Eucharist (either live or recorded). You will be able to pick up bags containing 5 consecrated hosts from the church office any Thursday between 10am and 2pm. If you do not have a key to the building, please call ahead so we can open the door.

Lent is almost here. (Ash Wednesday is February 1th.) For a number of years at St. Andrew's, some of us have taken part in a fun Lenten discipline by being someone's Lenten Friend. It is sort of like having a secret friend you pray for during Lent, letting the person know this by anonymously sending them a card or note periodically (usually once a week). You don't reveal yourself to this person until Easter (this year that is April 4th).

In the past people who wanted to participate have put their names and mailing addresses on slips of paper, which they have then put in a special box at church. COVID has changed the way we have to do a lot of things, and that is true of this, too.

If you would like to participate this year, I am asking that you e-mail your name and mailing address, or call me with that information by Shrove Tuesday, February 16th. I will then draw names for each of you, and let you know by e-mail or phone who your Lenten Friend is.
