An update from the Vestry

The vestry met this past Tuesday and had a lengthy discussion about worship and meetings for the rest of June and July and August. They made the following decisions:

1. Once we are able to purchase the supplies, we will be consecrating wine in the chalice and large flagon and then the wine will be poured into individual small cups for distribution. According to Dr. Shah, the risks of receiving from a common chalice are unknown.
2. On Sundays, we will continue with 8:00 am inside without music and 10:00 am outside with music until our next vestry meeting in September. The vestry is seeking to be as hospitable as possible to our members who cannot yet be vaccinated because they are under the age of 12. The CDC has made it very clear that taking part in inside worship with singing is an unsafe activity for unvaccinated people, even when they are masked. The Delta Variant of COVID has made it to this country, is more contagious, and is making those who catch it sicker, particularly children.
3. Anyone who is vaccinated may participate in indoor choir rehearsals and the choir will sing at the 10:00 am outside service.
4. We will resume serving refreshments outside after the 10:00 am service only.
5. Outside 12 step groups may meet in the building again on days when St. Andrew's groups are not meeting. We have decided in the office that Tuesdays and Wednesdays will be the days on which St. Andrew's groups may meet. We are confident that the vast majority of members of St. Andrew's are vaccinated, but we have no way of knowing the vaccination status of those who attend 12 Step meetings. By allowing them in the building on days when other groups are not meeting, we are able to give 24 hours between their meetings and other meetings.

Current mask policy at St. Andrew's

Inside: Fully vaccinated people are no longer required to wear a mask inside the St. Andrew's building. Social distancing is not required, though you may do so if you are more comfortable. **Unvaccinated people and people who are not fully immune must continue to wear a mask.**

Outside: Fully vaccinated people are no longer required to wear masks at our outside service. No social distancing is required, though you may do so if you are more comfortable. **Unvaccinated people and people who are vaccinated but not yet fully immune must continue to wear a mask.**

No sign up is required. There will be no congregational singing. Masks are no longer required (see above). You will be asked to sign in. Welcome back to inside worship!

Sunday, 10:00am - In-person, outdoor service of Holy Eucharist, Rite II

No sign up is required and please bring chairs as you are able. There will be congregational singing outside beginning in June. Masks are no longer required (see above) There will be no tent so please check your email for cancellation notification if the weather is bad or call the church and listen for an updated message. If the outdoor service is cancelled, you may watch the livestreamed indoor service on facebook or later on youtube.

If you are planning on attending the outdoor service on Sunday:

- The Congregation will be seated in the parking area by the church.
- Please bring chairs if you are able as we only have 35
- Please walk down to the parking area via the driveway, not the stairs. Ushers will be available for assistance.
- There will be designated handicap parking spots on either side of the driveway entrance.
- Please sign in. See you there!

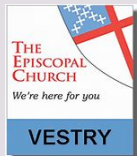
Wednesday, 10:00am - In-person, indoor service of Holy Eucharist, Rite II with healing prayers
