St. Andrew's Church services for July and August

Sunday, 8:00am - In-person, indoor service of Holy Eucharist, Rite I

No sign up is required. There will be no congregational singing. You will be asked to sign in. No masks required if you are vaccinated.

Sunday, 10:00am - In-person, outdoor service of Holy Eucharist, Rite II

No sign up is required and please bring chairs as you are able. There will be congregational singing outside beginning in June. Masks are no longer required. There will be no tent so please check your email for cancellation notification if the weather is bad or call the church and listen for an updated message. If the outdoor service is cancelled, you may watch the livestreamed indoor service on facebook or later on youtube.

- The Congregation will be seated in the parking area by the church.
- Please bring chairs if you are able as we only have 35
- Please walk down to the parking area via the driveway, not the stairs. Ushers will be available for assistance.

Update on Marc and Ralph Zoorob

Marc and Ralph had a good first semester at Lincoln Academy. They both earned all A's and a place on the high honor roll. They returned home at the end of the semester and will return to Lincoln Academy in mid to late August.

Home (Lebanon) is another story. The American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem wrote an article about the day-to-day experience of Imad Zoorob, Marc and Ralph's father, in Lebanon. Imad is the only Episcopal priest in Lebanon. He serves as the rector of All Saint's Church in Beirut, as well as director of St. Luke's Rehabilitation Center, the nearby boarding and day school for children with cognitive disabilities owned by the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem.

Imad said, "I get up at 6 a.m. to secure a place in line to get enough fuel to go the church." The rehabilitation center closed in March 2020 due to the pandemic, but Imad has stayed close to the students and staff and their families who are struggling financially. Imad established the Food for St. Luke's Families program which is supported by friends of The American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem.

According to the World Bank, the Lebanese Pound has lost 90% of its value. Life savings, the value of pensions, and the purchase power of wages have been reduced to virtually nothing. Imad explained, "People are still receiving their old wages which weren't enough to keep them afloat when the currency was normal. Imagine now with this rate. God help us all."

Imad is extraordinarily grateful that there is a different path for his sons. He wishes to thank everyone who has made their journey to the United States possible. If you have not and wish to contribute to their journey, you may through St. Andrew's (write Marc and Ralph Zoorob on the memo line). We will forward the money to the Diocese of Maine. Current mask policy at St. Andrew's
