Our vestry met on Tuesday afternoon and discussed our December worship at length. After considering the topic from multiple angles (safety, needs of various parishioners and so on), we decided on the following worship schedule for the month of December:

Beginning Sunday, December 5th:

<u>8 AM Rite I Holy Eucharist</u> inside the church, masked with no singing <u>9:15AM Sunday Morning Prayer:</u> On Zoom, led by seminarian and postulant for Holy Orders, Ben Cooke. He will be using the New Zealand Book of Common Prayer.

10 AM Rite II Holy Eucharist inside the church and live-streamed and recorded, masked with no singing

Wednesdays, 10 AM Rite II Holy Eucharist with healing (with masks)

Monday-Friday 9 PM Zoom Compline

Monday-Friday 7 AM Zoom Morning Prayer

Christmas Schedule:

12/24 Christmas Eve:

4 PM Family Service with simple pageant, masked with no singing inside 7:30 PM Holy Eucharist Rite II, masked with no singing inside

One of these services will be recorded and live-streamed.

12/25 Christmas Day:

10 AM Holy Eucharist inside the church, masked with no singing

1<u>2/26 1 Christmas</u>:

10 AM Rite II Holy Eucharist inside the church live-streamed and recorded, masked with no singing

The vestry sees worship as an "essential service" of the church and is making it a priority over other meetings. For safety reasons, the vestry is continuing to place limitations on other gatherings in the building.

The Way of Love: Practices for Jesus-Centered Life An Advent Adult Formation Offering

"The Way of Love" is a movement started by our Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry who believes our vocation is to live as the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement. The foundation of his movement is made up of ancient spiritual practices that bring us together as a community, center us on Jesus, and form us into followers of Jesus. These practices are: Turn--Learn--Pray--Worship--Bless--Go--Rest. For the four Sundays of Advent (beginning Nov. 28) at 11 am in the Undercroft and via Zoom, Suzannah will facilitate the Episcopal Church Advent Currciulum, Journeying the Way of Love. Together we will move through the first two chapters of the Gospel of Luke. Luke's gospel provides a pattern for understanding how we can live the Way of Love as individuals, as families and friends, as a community, and out in the world. Participants will be encouraged to "try on" the spiritual practices of the Way of Love throughout the days of Advent. When the group gathers each week, participants will use the first two

chapters of Luke to reflect with one another on how they experienced taking up the practices.
