MAINE HEARTS AND HANDS FOR HAITI

St. Andrew's Church has helped our little partner parish in northwest Haiti - St. Luc, Figaro – for over 20 years. Since the catastrophic earthquake in 2010, the church has also helped the greater community of Gros Morne, of which Figaro is a part, by participating in the annual dinners a number of us (called the Lincoln Country Ecumenical Committee For Haiti) have put on at St. Patrick's church. COVID prevented us from holding dinners in 2020 and 2021 so this year we decided to organize a Go Fund Me campaign during Lent. As in the past, the funds we raise will go to a community group in Gros Morne that has identified urgent needs and made sure the funds are used wisely by Gros Morne residents. You can do this alone through daily scripture or devotional reading, daily centering prayer, daily meditation, intentional work with those in need in the community, taking a particular spiritual practice on or giving something up.

You can also more intentionally focus on your journey with Jesus by joining offerings from St. Andrew's. Some offerings are particular to Lent and others are ongoing throughout the year, and Lent could be a time for you to try them out to see if they help you in your journey with Jesus.

Ecumenical Council for Homeless Prevention: the ECHP "Help Desk"

Did you know that local volunteers have been managing housing emergencies for ten years now, at Newcastle's Ecumenical Food Pantry? Typical problems include finding temporary space at a local motel for people who have been living in their car...or paying off a back CMP bill in order to avoid a power disconnection...or coming up with a heating oil delivery to a household with an empty tank. Longtime volunteers are Alden Sproul and Steve Ward (pictured), with assistance from other local churches. Tedford Housing supplies a caseworker to work on applications for subsidized housing and to access Maine Housing resources. ECHP relies on donations from seven local churches and from individuals. Feel free to stop by the Second Congregational Church in Newcastle any Tuesday morning between 9:00 and 11:00 to see the "Help Desk" in action.
