Note about the music for May 1

The tune for our opening hymn on April, TRURO, was first published in Thomas Williams's *Psalmodia Evangelica*, (second vol., 1789) as a setting for Isaac Watts' "Now to the Lord a noble song." Brian Wren adopted this tune for a hymn he wrote in Hockley, Essex, England, during April of 1968. Wren wrote this about his text:

It was written for Easter Sunday, two weeks after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. I could not let Easter go by without speaking of this tragic event which was on all our minds...The hymn tries to see God's love winning over tragedy and suffering in the world.

Sheepscot Valley Chorus

Sheepscot Valley Chorus begins its 41st season with April 30 and May 1 performances of Paul Winter's "Missa Gaia (Earth Mass): A Mass in Celebration of Mother Earth." The Chorus' performances of "Missa Gaia" celebrate the 52nd anniversary of Earth Day. Written by Paul Winter in 1981, the work was dedicated to St. Francis, the patron saint of ecology. In "Missa Gaia" Winter created a work both ecumenical and ecological, embracing all the voices of the Earth. The piece will feature African percussion, bass, cello, guitar, organ, piano, oboe, and soprano sax, along with animal calls. The concerts will be on Saturday, April 30 at 3:00 PM and Sunday, May 1 at 3:00 PM at the Second Congregational Church of Newcastle. Tickets are \$15 for adults and free for students, and may be purchased at Sherman's Bookstore in Damariscotta, Treats in Wiscasset, and at the door. All Chorus members are fully vaccinated for COVID-19, and will wear masks for the concerts. Audience members are encouraged to wear masks. HEARTS AND HANDS FOR HAITI

Our Go Fund Me campaign for Gros Morne ends May 2. There are many competing needs around the world and none so vital as Ukraine's in its struggle against the Russian invasion. The ongoing needs of the population of Haiti may not seem important in the face of Ukraine's suffering, but an atmosphere of crisis persists in Haiti. The World Food Program (WFP) of the United Nations announced in March of this year that hunger levels are on the rise and that as many as 4.5 million Haitians are experiencing "high levels of acute food insecurity." The WFP representative in Haiti noted the situation is "the worst since 2018."

In the light of these facts, won't you look again at the document in https://gofund.me/d8ea93cf and see the various projects established to help address food insecurity in Gros Morne - school lunches; agricultural extension supported programs of chicken and goat raising, seed for home vegetable gardens and seed and planting techniques for farmers.
