Letter from the Rector about the Common Cup

Dear Friends,

Out of necessity over the past two years, COVID has caused as to make a lot of liturgical innovations in our worship. First, we worshipped via zoom. Then we livestreamed with people receiving pre-consecrated bread at home while watching the service. We worshipped outside, and then finally returned inside to the nave as we became vaccinated. Through the early months of the pandemic, we ceased receiving wine at communion altogether as it was unclear whether COVID could be passed through the sharing of the "common cup." Even though communion is a completely valid sacrament when taken only in one kind, many missed the practice of receiving wine, so we instituted individual plastic cups. Throughout the many changes and innovations, we had the permission of our bishop and he and we thought the changes would only be in place for a short period of time. With the wisdom of hindsight, we all know how wrong our view was.

We are now in our third year of the pandemic, and it is clear that COVID is not going away. So, the question is this: what do we do about the innovations we made especially around the serving of the consecrated wine in individual cups? At our annual Diocese of Maine Clergy Conference, the Bishop asked us to discontinue any innovations in the distribution of bread and wine that we had begun as a result of the pandemic. He, like everyone, thought these would be short-lived innovations and is concerned that they are becoming common practice and a part of people's piety.

We will therefore return to the common cup beginning with the services on May 29.

Now I imagine that you have a few possible questions in your mind at this point. I have tried to anticipate and answer some of the questions you may have. You may access them by clicking <u>here</u>. There will also be printed copies in the back of the church on Sunday.

I give thanks for the great resiliency, perseverance, and flexibility of you the people of St. Andrew's. I know the many changes over the course of more than two years have been challenging for all of us. I give thanks that we have each other as we navigate the ever-changing world that we find ourselves in. I give thanks that God has sustained us.
