Doctrine of Discovery Learning Weekend

The Rev. Byron David Stuhlman, Ph.D., a longtime member of St. Andrew's, Newcastle, and an adjunct professor at General Theological Seminary (GTS), died in hospice care in Scarborough on July 18. He was 85.

A native of Dayton, OH, Byron graduated from Yale University in 1963 and and GTS in 1966. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1967 and served as a curate at Christ Church Cathedral in Hartford, CT, before moving to Bridgewater, CT, where he was rector of St. Mark's and St. Thomas of Canterbury in nearby Sherman. While studying for his doctorate at Duke University, he was a priest associate of St. Philip's in Durham, NC. He then taught as a visiting professor at Hamilton College and served churches in Central New York in addition to joining the faculty at GTS.

Byron and his late wife, Hester Catherine (Krusen) Stuhlman, summered in Maine since 1969 and retired to their home in Round Pond in 2007. A board member of the Friends of Colonial Pemaquid and the Round Pond Schoolhouse Association, he was also the former president of Coastal Senior College. He had a deep interest in liturgical history and was the author of six books and several scholarly articles.

Byron was a deeply humanistic man who participated in civil rights marches in Montgomery, AL and Washington, D.C.; he was an early advocate for women's ordination in The Episcopal Church and served on the church's inclusive language committee for the Book of Common Prayer.

In addition to his wife, Byron was predeceased by his brother, James Lee Stuhlman. He is survived by his son, Dr. Jonathan Daniel Stuhlman, his wife Dr. Megan Williams Stuhlman, and their children Justin Williams Stuhlman and Finnian George Stuhlman, of Charlotte, NC. He is also survived by his nephews, Luther and Bradley Stuhlman, his sister-in-law, Jennifer Kenna, and her sons Timothy, Eric, and Brian Kenna.

Music Notes August 9th

Many of the organ voluntaries I select for our worship services are based on German chorale tunes, derived from Protestant hymns developed in 16th-century Germany in the Lutheran tradition, sung in the vernacular German rather than Latin. Chorale preludes were written to introduce the melody before the congregation sings and were harmonized in four parts by countless composers, the most famous being Johann Sebastian Bach. Bach wrote over 400 four-part chorales. Other German Baroque composers such as Dieterich Buxtehude, Johann Pachelbel and many others made significant contributions to the Lutheran keyboard repertoire. This morning we hear two settings of “Allein Gott in der Hoh sei Her” (All Glory be to God on High) by Johann Gottfried Walther (1684–1748), a cousin to Bach, who wrote nearly 300 chorale preludes, and Nicolaus Vetter (1666–1734) who studied under Johann Pachelbel. The closing voluntary is one of Bach’s settings of “Es ist gewisslich an der Zeit” (The Day is surely drawing near).

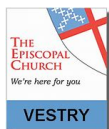
Holy Women, Holy Men
